


#### **Common ILS - Background**

- The Federated Libraries Integrated ILS Project (FLIP) grants established to enable library federations to purchase state– of-the-art, standards-based ILS's.
- "Non-Public" partner grant condition.
- Six groups were engaged in the evaluation and procurement process leading to a common ILS.
- Relationships, making friends, empowering.

#### **Common ILS – More Background**

- 53 BC public libraries (74%) had envisioned a migration to Horizon 8
- 14 Horizon 7.x public libraries face a major migration in the next few years.




#### **Spring 2007**;

- 2. ILS Governance Committee and Functional Sub-Committees


Ultimately, a community operated ILS






#### **Overall Risk Assessment:**

Evergreen open ILS presents no greater risk than that associated with the acquisition of an ILS product in the traditional vendor marketplace.



#### **Risk reducers:**


- software and hardware architecture are in use in a jurisdiction of similar size and composition to BC; scaleable
- Knowledge transfer; an open community provides opportunities for "By and for BC"; No need for escrow clauses
- For those BC libraries who might not opt in to Evergreen, its existence in the province would serve as insurance against a volatile marketplace



#### More risk reducers:

- Significantly lower Total Cost of Ownership compared with traditional solutions (\$4M vs \$10M over 5 years)
- Centralized database and centralized staffing ensure service continuity and relieve local pressures while fostering a development community
- As we demonstrate success, others will come around ...

#### Georgia Public Library Service wins Mellon Award for Technology Collaboration



WASHINGTON, D.C. - The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation has named the Georgia Public Library Service as one of 10 recipients of the second annual Mellon Awards for Technology Collaboration. The \$50,000 grant recognizes GPLS for the development and release of the Evergreen open-source library automation system.

The Mellon Awards honor not-for-profit

organizations for leadership in the collaborative development of open-source software tools with particular application to higher education and cultural heritage not-for-profit activities. The awards were presented Dec. 10 by Sir Timothy Berners-Lee, director of the World Wide Web Consortium and inventor of the World Wide Web, at the Fall Task Force meeting of the Coalition for Networked Information.
