What Is The Open Access Authors Fund?

- The Open Access Authors Fund is designed to pay the fees charged by some publishers for articles to be published in Open Access (OA) journals by University of Calgary authors
- Money comes solely from Libraries and Cultural Resources (LCR) funds
- One of about 40 or so similar funds around the world
- Other funds in Canada include SFU and Ottawa

Some History

- BMC membership change (\$5,000 to \$50,000)
- Growth of OA publishing programs (fully OA journals, "hybrid" programs)
- Increasing knowledge and discussion of OA
- Unequal access among authors to money to pay OA fees
- June 2008 start
- 1st in Canada, 6th in the world

Criteria – For Authors

- Who is eligible?
 - Faculty, staff, graduate students, postdoctoral researchers, adjuncts
 - No undergraduate students

Criteria – For Journals/Publishers

- What is eligible?
 - Fully Open Access journals e.g. BMC, PLoS, Hindawi, some others
 - "Hybrid" Open Access journals where subscription costs are lowered in response to the take-up of the OA program e.g. OUP, AIP, Springer

Other Criteria

- No limits to the number of submissions or costs
- Other fees (e.g. illustration, colour, page charges) are not covered
- Articles only (for now)
- Authors have to exhaust other funding before applying to the Fund
- Author options:
 - Put article in institutional repository
 - Use article in promotion of the Fund

The Fund In Action (part 1)

- Operating since September 2008
 - Are part-way through 4th fiscal year
- Started with a "soft launch" and just rolled into regular operations
- 204 accepted articles
- Most authors from biomedical fields but the disciplines represented are broadening
- 13 publishers represented
 - BMC has the most articles (by far) followed by Hindawi and PLoS

The Fund In Action (part 2)

- 106 different journals
 - PLoS One has the most articles followed by BMC Health Services Research and Journal of Trauma Management and Outcomes
- Average payment=\$1643 CAN
- Range of payments: \$200-\$3146 CAN
- Some prepayments and memberships e.g.
 BMC, Hindawi

Some Issues

- Are we meeting a need?
- Are we creating any sort of actual change?
- Are we paying more than if we just had individual subscriptions?
- Can we continue to meet demand?
- The Fund vs. the economic situation
- Beyond journal articles
