### Open Access

"...free availability on the public internet, permitting any users to read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or link to the full texts of these articles, crawl them for indexing, pass them as data to software, or use them for any other lawful purpose, without financial, legal, or technical barriers other than those inseparable from gaining access to the internet itself. Authors control over the integrity of their work and the right to be properly acknowledged and cited. The literature that should be freely accessible online is that which scholars give to the world without expectation of payment."


